Assemble at Changi airport and take off to capital of Italy, Rome.

### DAY 02 ROME

(Meals on Board/Dinner)

**Vatican City**, an independent city state located in the heart of Rome, ruled by the Pope. It is the centre of authority over the Roman Catholic Church.

**St Peter's Basilica**, one of the world's holiest catholic shrines, visited by thousands of pilgrims and tourists every month. Built upon

the tomb of St Peter, this splendid church is a magnificent must-see for visitors to Rome.



**Rome**, capital of Italy, was called the "Eternal City" by the ancient Romans. Surrounded by glorious monuments and colossal

remains, it feels like back in time to the "glory that was Rome".

**Colosseum**, is the main symbol of Rome. It is an imposing construction that, with almost 2,000 years of history, will bring you back in time to discover the way of life in the Roman Empire.



**Roman Forum**, was where religious and public life in ancient Rome took place. The Forum is, along with the Colosseum, the greatest sign of the splendour of the Roman Empire that can be seen today.

**Piazza Venezia**, located in the center of four major roads of Rome. It was named after the Cardinal Venezia, who ordered the construction of his place, Palazzo Venezia, in 1455. This building later became the seat of "Serenissima" (Republic of Venice).

**Piazza Spagna**, one of Rome's most renowned squares where the Spanish Steps is located. The name comes from the Palazzo di Spagna, the seat of the Spanish Embassy for the Vatican located on this square since the seventeenth century.

**Trevi Fountain**, is the most beautiful fountain in Rome. Measuring some 20 meters in width by 26 meters in height, Trevi Fountain is also the largest fountain in the city.

**DAY 03 ROME** **THE MALL OUTLET**   
**FLORENCE** **TUSCANY**  
 (Breakfast/Florentine Steak Dinner)

**The Mall Factory Outlet**, an open-air luxury outlet mall located in the small town of Leccio (Tuscany). The outlet stores here are known for offering steep discounts on European luxury goods ranging from 35% to 70%, compared to retail prices.

**\*Note:** Factory outlet close on local public holiday, outlet replacement is subject to change without prior notice in the event of unforeseen circumstances.

**Florence**, an **UNESCO World Heritage site** and the birthplace of the Renaissance. The soul of Tuscany brims with Renaissance influence evident in its myriad architectural and artistic wonders.



**Duomo di Firenze**, its enormous dome and tall Campanile dominate the city's outline. Both buildings are located very near the Battistero di San Giovanni (Florence Baptistery) in the Piazza del Duomo. The Cathedral is officially called Cattedrale di Santa Maria del Fiore.

**Baptistry of Saint John**, Located opposite the Florence Cathedral, also known as Battistero di San Giovanni, is believed to be the oldest building of the Piazza del Duomo. Much like the other buildings on the square, the Baptistery's façade is coated in white and green marble.

**Piazza del Duomo**, is the square houses the city's Cathedral, the Campanile di Giotto and the Battistero di San Giovanni, all of which make up Florence's most famous landmarks, along with the Ponte Vecchio.

**Piazza San Giovanni**, a city square in Florence, Italy. Buildings around the square Florence Baptistery.

**Piazza Della Repubblica**, a vast, quadrangular square in the center of Florence. Surrounded by caffès and elegant restaurants, it's considered the upper-class salon of the city, and is often a theater to musicians and street artists.

**Palazzo Vecchio**, the palace is built like a fortress with crenelated walls and a 309 ft (94 m) tower. It is one of the city's most important symbols.

**Piazza Della Signoria**, is Florence's main square. It is located between the Piazza del Duomo and the Arno River.

**Ponte Vecchio**, is Florence's most legendary symbol, just like the Colosseum is the most famous landmark in Rome. It is also considered by many as the most romantic spot in Florence.

**DAY 04 TUSCANY** **PISA** **VENICE**  
 (Breakfast/Chinese Dinner)

**Pisa**, an old port city located on the west coast of Italy, in Tuscany. It became famous worldwide because of its unusual leaning tower, the Leaning Tower of Pisa.



**Piazza del Miracoli**, known as Square of Miracles, it flaunts four beautiful marble monuments standing out from the surrounding green expanse.

**Baptistry of Saint John**, this marble giant is almost as tall as the 'queen' of the piazza, the Leaning tower. It is in fact the largest baptistry in Italy standing at 55 meters and with a circumference of more than 100 meters.

**Duomo**, one of the wonders of Italy, a masterpiece of Pisan Romanesque architecture chiefly famous for its bell tower, the Leaning Tower of Pisa.

**Leaning Tower**, one of the most remarkable architectural structures from medieval Europe. It is the bell tower, or campanile of the Duomo. One of the four buildings that make up the cathedral complex in Piazza dei Miracoli.

**Optional: Siena**

**Siena**, an **UNESCO World Heritage site**. One of the best-preserved Medieval towns in the whole of Italy. The most important attractions are the shell-shaped main square Piazza del Campo, known simply as Il Campo by the locals, and the Cathedral square, dominated by a stunning Gothic Duomo that is a real feast for the eyes.

**DAY 05 VENICE** **MILAN**  
 (Breakfast)

**Venice**, the capital of the Veneto region, is a cultural and architectural jewel, rich in history.

**Bridge of Sighs**, or Ponte dei Sospiri in Italian is a named bridge in Venice that links the Palazzo Ducale with the prisons. It was built during the 16th century, by the architect Antonio Contini as a covered pathway with small battlements instead of windows.



**St Mark's Basilica**, an iconic symbol of Venice. Initially designed to function as a private chapel for the Doge, the church over centuries, took up a significant role in the religious and political life of the city.

**Doge's Palace**, a combine of Byzantine, Gothic and Renaissance's building, situated in Piazza San Marco. The Palazzo Ducale was originally a fortified castle founded between the tenth and eleventh centuries. The Palazzo was used as a fortress and prison.

**St Mark's Clock Tower**, is the Clock Tower of San Marco Square, Venice, Italy, is one of the most famous symbols of the city: a masterpiece of architecture and engineering marking the time of the Venice Republic for over five centuries.

**St Mark Campanile**, the bell tower of the St. Mark's Basilica, located in the beautiful St. Mark's Square, in Venice. The bell tower is by far the most important attraction of the city and one of the most famous symbols of Italy.

**Murano Glass Making Factory**, the origins of glassmaking in Venice since Roman Empire.

**Optional: Gondola Ride**

**Gondola**, a traditional narrow and long Venetian rowing boat. The boat is steered by one person called a gondolier with the help of one long oar.

**DAY 06 MILAN 🚆 INTERLAKEN**

(Breakfast/Lunch/Swiss Fondue Dinner)

**Milan**, the capital city of the region of Lombardy in northern Italy. It is the second largest city by population in Italy, behind Rome. It is Italy's leading financial centre and its most prosperous manufacturing and commercial city.

**Sforza Castle**, was built as a fortress during the fourteenth century and is one of the most famous landmarks in Milan. Presently, it houses one of the best museums in the city.

**La Scala Opera House**, or Teatro alla Scala in Italian, is one of the most famous opera houses in the world. Its sober and elegant exterior never fails to surprise those that visit it for the first time.

**Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II**, which is sometimes nicknamed "il salotto di Milano" (Milan's drawing room), is an elegant nineteenth-century shopping arcade. It houses some of the most luxurious boutiques in Milan.

**Milan Cathedral**, called Duomo di Milano in Italian, is a vast Gothic-style cathedral, located in the heart of Milan. It is 515 ft (157 metres) long and 302 ft (92 m) wide. It can house up to 40,000 people. Il Duomo di Milano is one of the largest Catholic churches in the world.

**Interlaken**, in the heart of Switzerland, beautifully situated between mountains and lakes. Explore the resort town on your own, relax your mind in the town with the breath-taking backdrop of Eiger, Monch and Jungfrau forming part of a stunning natural landscape.

**Optional: Jungfrauoch**

**Jungfrauoch**, UNESCO-listed, a col and a



glacial pass between the Jungfrau Mountain and the Mönch mountain. Jungfrauoch is also known as "Top of Europe", because it's the highest train station in Europe at 3,454 meters.

**DAY 08 INTERLAKEN 🚆 MOUNT TITLIS 🚆**

**LUCERNE 🚆 ZURICH REGION**

(Breakfast/Lunch at Titlis)

**Mount Titlis**, is a mountain in Central Switzerland, to be reached by a revolving cable car. At 3032 m, you can enjoy the eternal snow and the beautiful views. There are many cable rides up mountains in the Swiss Alps, but Mt Titlis claims the distinction of being the world's first rotating cable car. The floor of cable car gondola, with panoramic windows, makes one 360-degree rotation as the passengers view the scenery from the Stand station to the top.

**Lake Lucerne**, is the lake with the greatest scenic variety in the country. It is somewhat reminiscent of a fjord landscape yet remains characterised by a mild lake climate.

**Lucerne**, the gateway to central Switzerland, sited on Lake Lucerne, is embedded within an impressive mountainous panorama.



**Lion Monument**, a giant dying lion carved out of a wall of sandstone rock above a pond at the east end of the medieval town. It was designed as a memorial for the mercenary soldiers from central Switzerland who lost their lives while serving the French king Louis XVI during the French Revolution.

**Chapel Bridge**, Europe's oldest and the world-famous timber bridge, most photographed destination in Lucerne.

**Bucherer**, a fame duty free store in Switzerland.

**DAY 09 ZURICH REGION 🚆 TITISEE 🚆 COL-**

**MAR 🚆 LORRAINE REGION**

(Breakfast/Pork Knuckle Lunch/French Dinner)

**Titisee**, the community of Titisee lies on the north shore of Titisee, a lake in the eastern Feldberg in the Black Forest, which ranges from 780 to 1192m above sea level. The community of Neustadt is found 5 km to the east.



**Cuckoo Clock Making**, a favourite souvenir of travellers in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland, and particularly the Black Forest region of Germany. The clock is prized for a number of its features. The outer worked wood case is usually made of beautiful dark wood that is intricately carved with folk and forest scenes.

**Lake Titisee**, the largest natural lake in the Black Forest, the Titisee, offers space for extraordinary outdoor activities. Pedal boats and stand-up paddling equipment can be rented here.

**Colmar**, it's as if it taken from the pages of a medieval folk tale. At times the Route des Vins d'Alsace fools us into thinking we are back in 1454, and here, in the alley-woven heart of the old town, the illusion is complete.

**Old Town**, a medieval town from the 13th century, located in Alsace. It's one of the many picturesque villages on the legendary 170-km-long Alsace Wine Route.

Accommodation: Mercure Nancy Centre Stanislas or similar

## DAY 10 LORRAINE REGION 🚗 PARIS (Breakfast)

Paris, capital of France, is one of the most important and influential cities in the world. In terms of tourism, Paris is the second most visited city in Europe after London.

**Eiffel Tower**, a wrought iron tower that stands 1,063 ft (324 m) tall. It was designed for the Exposition Universelle, a world fair held in Paris in 1889. It is currently the most famous symbol of Paris.

**Arc de Triomphe**, along with the Eiffel Tower, one of the main symbols of Paris. It stands 146 ft (50 metres) tall, 148 ft (45 metres) wide and 72 ft (22 metres) deep. The monument represents all the French military victories in the Napoleonic Wars.



**Champs-Élysées**, the most beautiful and well-known avenue in Paris. It connects Arc de Triomphe with the Place de la Concorde and is considered one of the world's most famous commercial streets.

**Place de La Concorde**, the second largest square in France, situated between Champs-Élysées and the Tuileries Garden, and due to its history it's one of the city's most representative public squares.

**Grand and Petit Palais**, The Grand and the Petit Palais are often considered to present the Paris major exhibitions. Though both were built for the 1900 Universal Exhibition, these two buildings facing each other, along the Seine, in the axis of Pont Alexandre III, nevertheless have a different vocation.

**Pont Alexandre III**, the most fascinating bridge in Paris. The overpass, opened for the Exposition Universelle (World Exhibition) of 1900 in Paris, is located between L'Hôtel des Invalides and the Grand and Petit Palais.

**National Assembly**, the first revolutionary government of the French Revolution and existed from June 14th to July 9th in 1789.

**Louvre Museum**, sightseeing the world's largest museum with an extremely impressive art collection. It is located along the Seine River in Paris, France.



**Galleries Lafayette**, one of the most popular, chic and distinguished shopping centers in

Paris. Beauty and fashion enthusiasts are passionately attached to this city, where some of the most remarkable fashion moments happened since the time of Kings and Queens.

**\*Note:** Galeries Lafayette is closed on Christmas, New Year's Eve, and Labour Day

**Optional: Moulin Rouge Show/Seine River Cruise**

**Moulin Rouge Show**, a cabaret show in Paris, France. It is considered to be one of the biggest tourist attractions in this city because of its famous, world-renowned, risqué musical performances by beautiful, talented, half-naked dancers.

**Seine River Cruise**, romantic, offbeat, enchanting. A cruise on the River Seine is always an unforgettable moment.

Accommodation: Mercure Paris Ivry Quai De Seine or similar
